## Major OLIVE JEAN MICHELMORE:

Born 6th April, 1916, Miss Michelmore enlisted in South Australia. On completion of the first Officers' Training Course, Lieutenant Michelmore was posted to the 4th Military District, Southern Command, as from 28th January, 1942. She acted as Quartermaster for that District for the AWAS, and was promoted to Temporary Captain, Adjutant and Quartermaster on 4th November, 1942. Captin Michelmore served in South Australia until 30th July, 1943, when she was posted to AWAS Headquarters, First Australian Army (AIF), Toowoomba, Queensland.

On 25th November of the same year, Captain Michelmore became Assistant Controller, AWAS Headquarters, First Australian Army (AIF) and was promoted to Temporary Major on the 4th August, 1944. She was transferred to LHQ, Melbourne on 14th July, to become Assistant Controller, Administration, AWAS Headquarters.

When Lieutenant-Colonel Isla Murphy became AAG (WS) LHQ, Major Michelmore was posted to her staff as Deputy Assistant Adjutant General (AWAS), where she continued to serve until her demobilisation in March, 1946. Subsequently, Miss Michelmore trained as a speech pathologist. At Ballarat, Victoria, she opened the first country clinic of its kind in Australia, and was later appointed to the Melbourne Children's Hospital. For many years, she has been in charge of the speech pathology Department of the Adelaide Children's Hospital. She has been instrumental in setting up all the major speech pathology clinics in South Australia, and is also in private practice there.
